Year 3 had a wonderful day today visiting both Gazegill Organic Farm near Gisburn and Bolton Abbey. They were joined by Lee and Jen from the Ernest Cook Trust. The Trust help fund and organise this trip

At Gazegill, children (and staff) enjoyed meeting the farm animals—goats, cattle, pigs and sheep dogs.







They explored the farm fields and learnt more about the plants and wildlife. The children found out why Gazegill is an organic farm.





Everyone ate icecream made from the cows' organic milk. It tasted delicious!

Year 3 met pigs, including a runt piglet—the last and smallest piglet born in the litter. Year 3 have just started reading Charlotte's Web. This story is set on a farm. The two main characters are a pig and a spider. Visiting a farm has helped the children to imagine the setting for this story.
