

Poetry Week continued......

Reception enjoyed creating a poem about a Pet Class Monster. Then they designed their own picture of the monster.

Year 1 loved listening to different riddles. They chose an animal, then wrote their own riddle about an animal.



Year 2 learnt what a syllable is and how many syllables there are in different words. Then they wrote haiku poems. These short poems have three lines. Each line has a specific number of syllables in it. Year 2's haiku

poems are about Bonfire Night!

Year 3 learnt how to write limericks. A limerick is a nonsense poem that includes rhyming words at the end of lines. They wrote and illustrated their own limericks.

Year 4 have created their own kenning poem to describe Halloween creatures. Then they created watercolour

silhouette art work of their creature.

Year 5 have had a fantastic week learning about and writing their own renga poems. They have also learnt about the poet, Kit Wright and written their own versions of Kit's poem 'The Magic Box.

Year 6 have had a brilliant week creating poems about Armistice Day. They started creating them with Ash Dickinson then finished them later on in the week. In their

poems they have included a range of poetic features such as similes, metaphors, personification and rhyming couplets. Year 6 will be sharing their poems during our Remembrance Day Assembly on Monday 11th

Primary school admissions for 2025 are now open:

If your child is in their last year of nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: www.lancashire.gov.uk/ schools

It's quick and easy to do. You will receive an email confirmation of your application.

You must apply even if you already have older siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

The closing date for primary applications for September 2025 is 23:59 on 15 January 2025.

This involves children brushing their teeth in school every day under the supervision of staff. The project encourages children to get in to the good habit of brushing their teeth every single day—both at school and at home.




