Notice of Election

Dear Parent,

There are places for **2** parent governor(s) on the governing body of this school. They are elected by the parents of pupils at this school and nursery to serve a **4** year term of office. There is now a vacancy for **2** parent governors. You may, if you wish, put yourself forward for election, using the attached nomination form. Please read the information given with this form.

The timetable for the election is:-

- Nomination form to be returned to me at the school office by 12.00 noon on Monday 20th January 2025
- Ballot papers to be sent to all parents on Wednesday 22nd January 2025
- Ballot papers to be returned to me at the school office by 12.00 noon on Monday 3rd February 2025
- The votes will be counted at 1.30pm on Monday 3rd February 2025 after which the result will be announced.

Governors have an important and influential role to play in the life of our school, and I do hope you will be able to take part in this election by becoming a candidate and by casting your vote when the time comes.

Parent Governor Election

This info about the Parent Governor Elections was published on class dojo pages Monday 6th Jan.

Hard copies of completed form will be sent home on Monday.

Information

A. Eligibility

- All parents of pupils at the school and, in the case of maintained nursery schools, parents of children for whom educational or other provision is made on the premises of the school can be nominated as a candidate for a parent governor election except for:
 - (a) Elected Members of the Local Authority
 - (b) Anyone paid to work at the school for more than 500 hours in any consecutive 12 month period.

B. Nomination

- Any parent who wants to be nominated has to be proposed and seconded by two other parents of pupils (children) at the school using the nomination form on the page opposite. It should be completed and sent to the Returning Officer by 12.00 noon on Monday 20th January 2025
- Please note there can be no extension beyond this time and date.
- Candidates should complete the reverse of the nomination form with biographical details. This information will be sent with the voting papers to all parents to help them decide how to use their votes.

C. Parent Governors

(See also information sheet on parent governors)

- The governing body of the school has several categories of governor, and "parent governor" is one of these categories. All governors carry equal status.
- Responsibility rests in the governing body as a whole. Individual governors only have responsibility collectively in the governing body. To be a governor does not give personal authority.
- The term of office for a parent governor is 4 years, and a parent governor does not have to resign if his/her child ceases to be a pupil at the school before that period of time ends, though s/he may do so if s/he wishes.

D. Disqualification

 Regulations disqualify certain individuals from becoming a governor. The attached appendix lists the disqualification criteria. Prospective governors should read it carefully before proceeding with their nomination.

Absence Procedure

When you know your child is off school ill please call and leave us a message. Then we know why your child is not in school.

When your child is not in school, the office staff will:

- send a text message to remind parents that school needs to know why your child is absent.
- make a phone call when they have not yet heard back from you.
- ask Mrs. Peake to make a home visit.

When you receive a text from school you can either reply to the text we have sent you OR just give us a ring.
